## **IMPLEMENTATION OF RESERVATION POLICY RELATING TO ADMISSION OF STUDENTS IN THE PRIVATE UNAIDED EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS**

1. Manav Rachna International Institute of Research and Studies (formerly Manav Rachna International University) was declared as a Deemed to be University by the Central Govt., on the recommendation of the UGC-vide Notification No.F.-3/2007-U.3(A)dated 21<sup>st</sup> Oct, 2008 issued by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Govt. of India. The MHRD Notification dated 21<sup>st</sup> Oct, 2008 does not contain any condition relating to implementation of reservation policy to admission of students in the Deemed to be University.
2. Further, as regards reservation in admission/employment in the Private Unaided Educational Institutions, it may be noted that the 7 – Judge Constitution Bench of the Hon’able Supreme Court of India, in its unanimous judgment dated 12.08.2005, in P.A. Inamdar Vs. State of Maharashtra, held (in para-125) that:

“As per our understanding, neither in the judgement of Pai Foundation or in the Constitution Bench decision in Kerala Education Bill which approved by Pai Foundation there is anything which would allow the state to regulate or control admissions in the Unaided Professional Educational Institutions so as compel them to give up a share of the available seats to the candidates chosen by the state, if it was filling the seats available to be filled up at its discretion in such private Institutions. This would amount to nationalization of seats which has been specifically disapproved in Pai Foundation. Such imposition of quota of state of seats or enforcing reservation policy of the state on available seats in unaided professional institutions are acts constituting serious encroachment on the right and

**Institutions...."XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX Merely because the resources of the State in providing Professional education are limited, Private Educational Institutions, which intend to provide better professional education, cannot be forced by the State to make admissions on the basis of Reservation Policy to less meritorious candidate...."**

3. In view of the above position, reservation in admission of students in the Private Self-financing Deemed Universities is not applicable. However, the MRIIRS always encourages and facilitates the admission seekers from the reserved categories and keep their rights reserved for admission in all disciplines, with all facilities, relaxation and benefits under the Reservation Policy.
