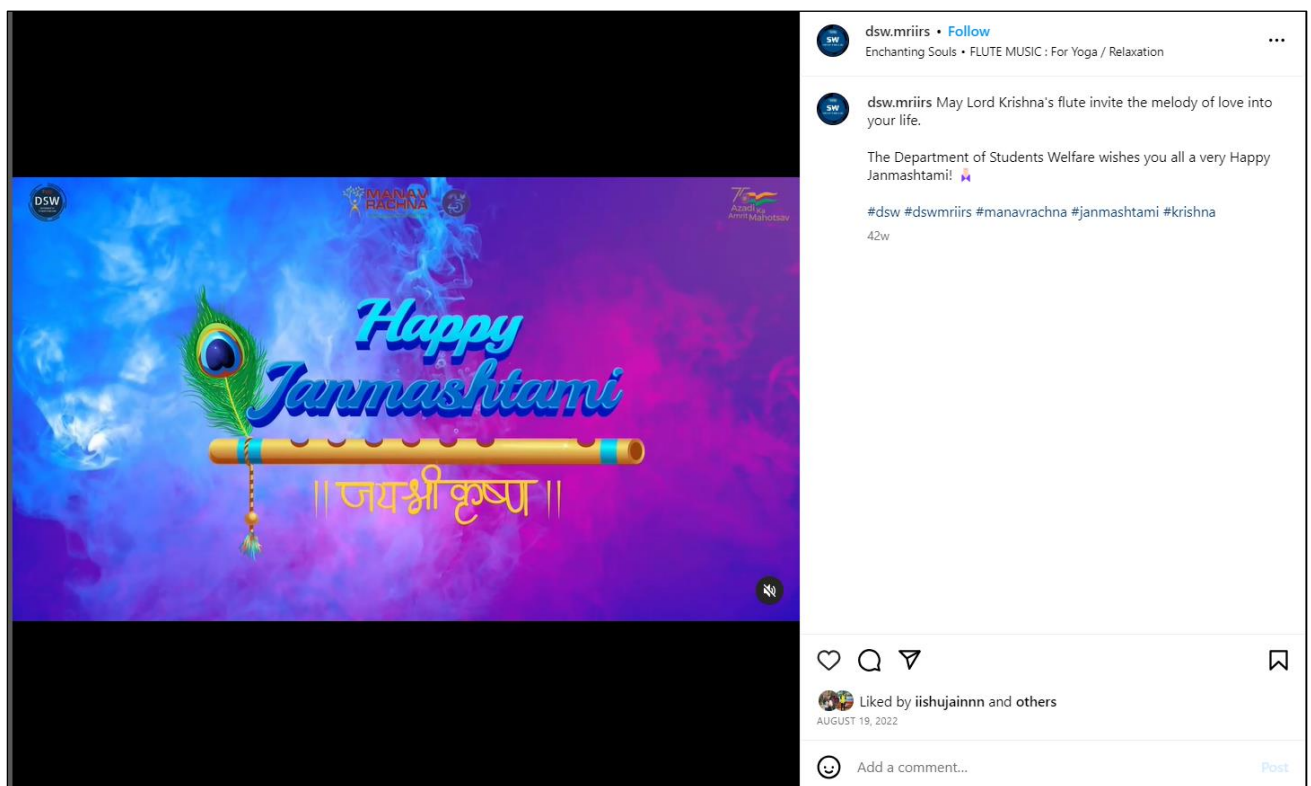

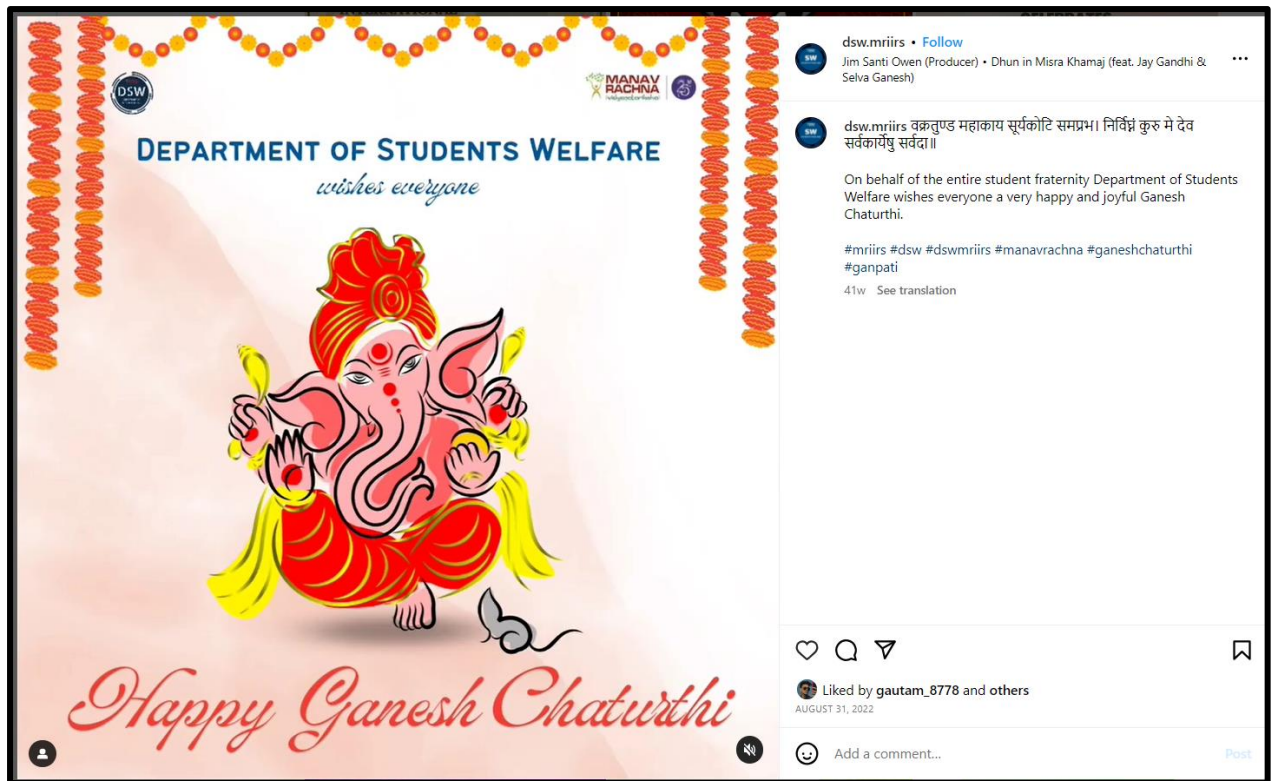
Celebration of Janmashtami

Janmashtami, a Hindu festival, celebrates the birth of Lord Krishna, the eighth avatar of Lord Vishnu. Observed on the eighth day of the Hindu calendar month of Bhadrapada, it typically falls in August or September. Devotees fast, sing devotional songs, reenact scenes from Krishna's life, and participate in lively processions. Dahi Handi, where young men form human pyramids to break a pot of curd hung high, is a popular Janmashtami tradition.



Celebration of Ganesh Chaturthi

Ganesh Chaturthi, a significant Hindu festival, celebrates the birth of Lord Ganesha, the elephant-headed god of wisdom and prosperity. Observed during the Hindu month of Bhadrapada, typically in August or September, it involves the installation of Ganesha idols in homes and public places. Devotees offer prayers, perform aarti (rituals), and immerse the idols in water bodies, symbolizing the deity's return to his abode. It's a time of great festivities, cultural performances, and community bonding.

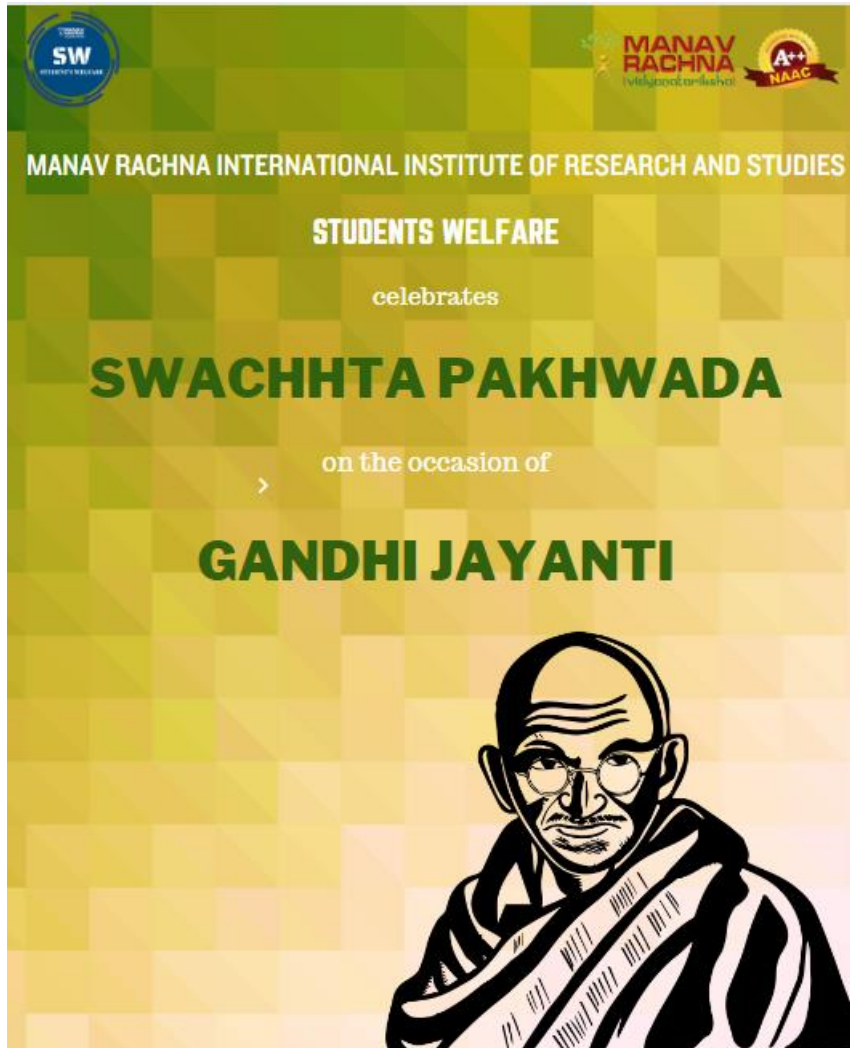

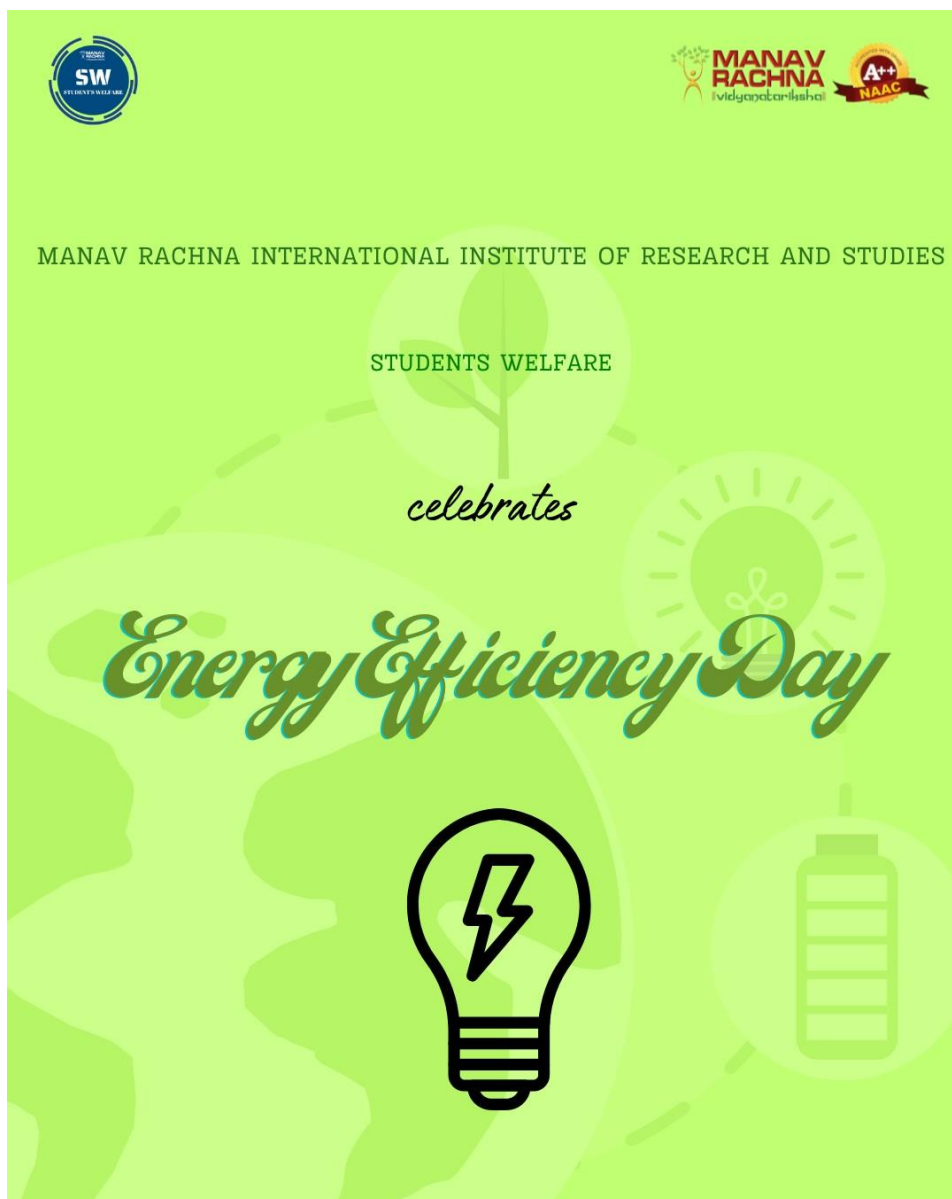
Observance of Swachhta Pakhwada

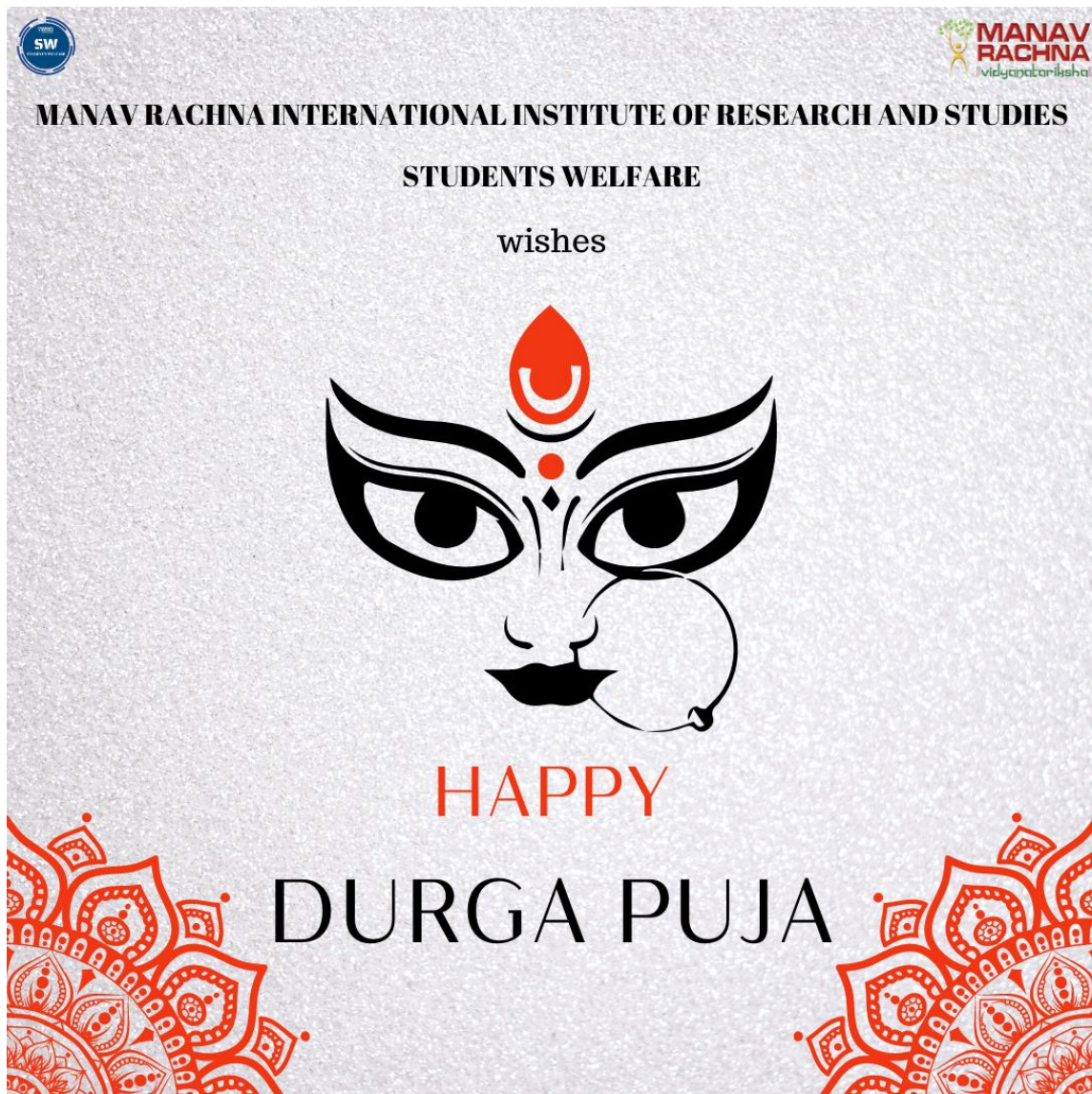
Energy Efficiency Day

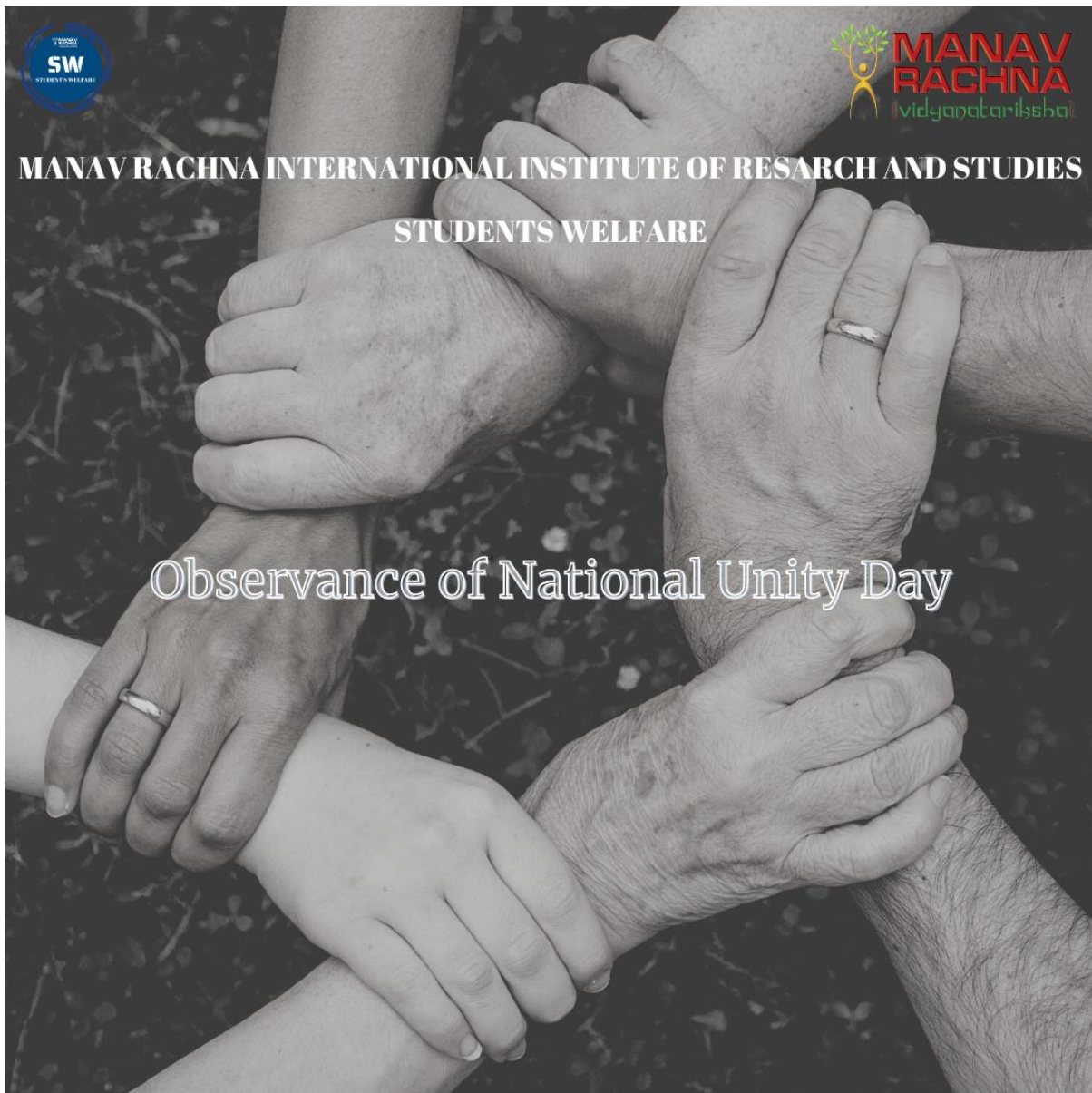

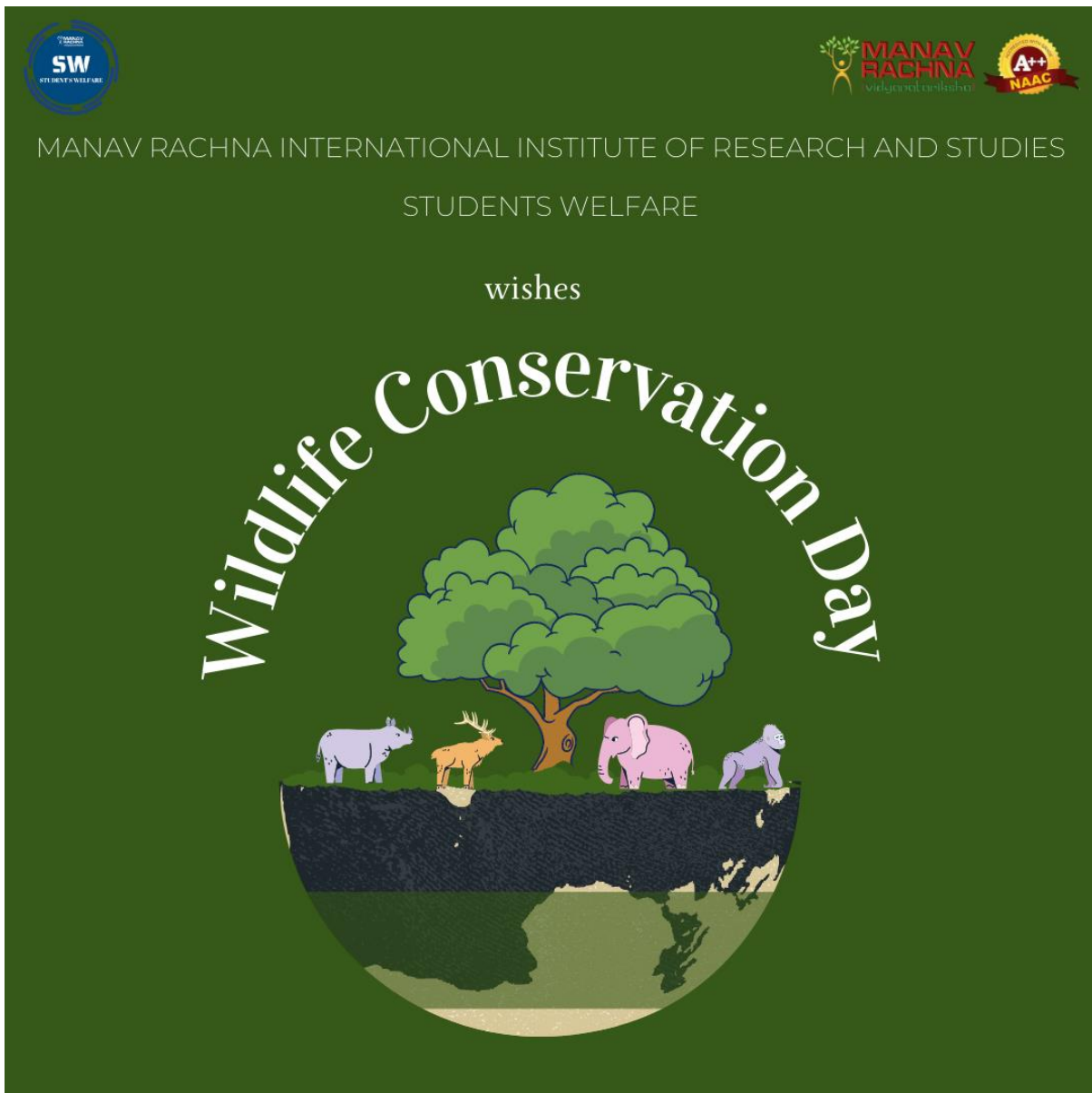






Wildlife Conservation Day


