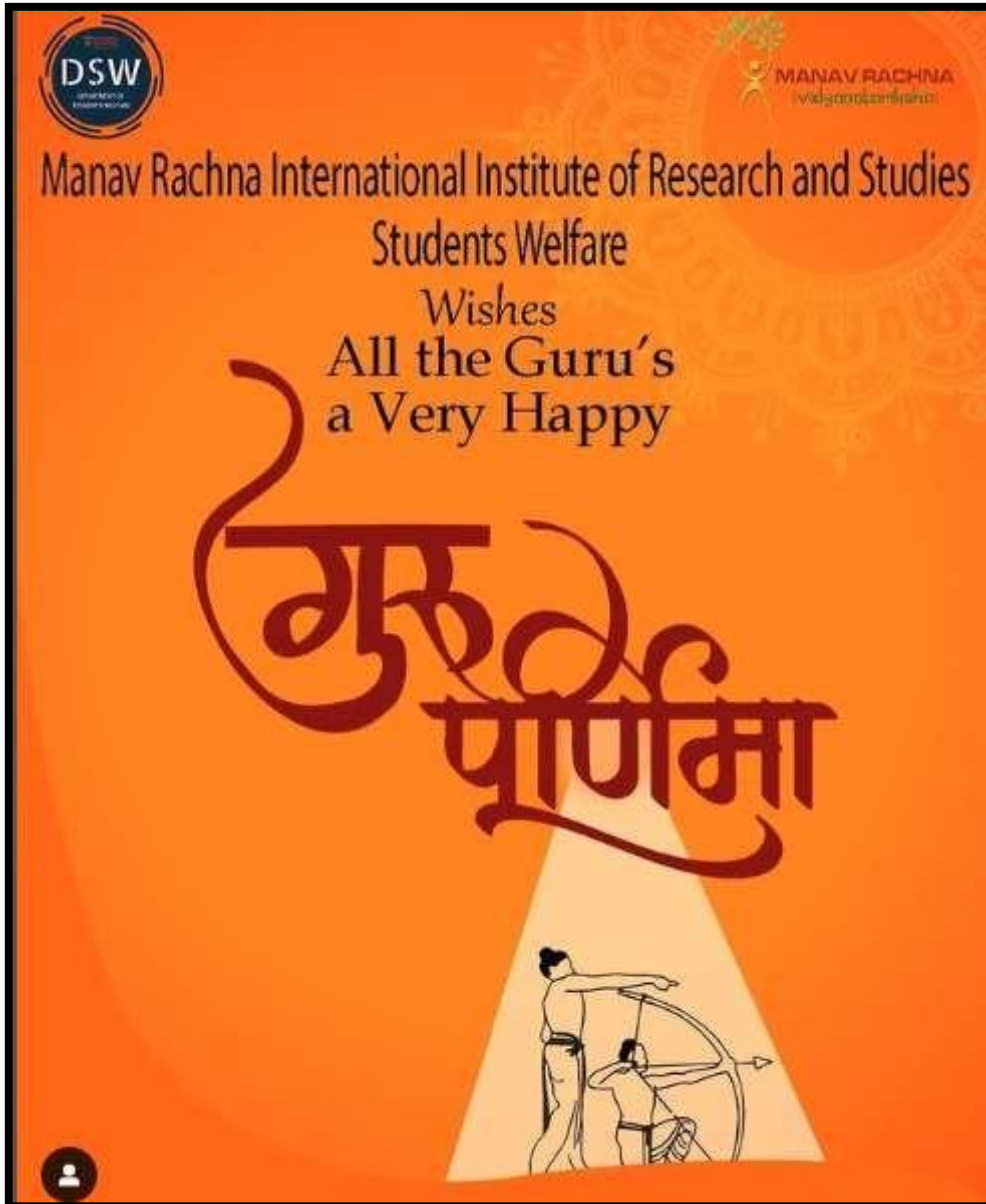


### SANGGATTVAM: CELEBRATION OF MATRIBASHA DIWAS

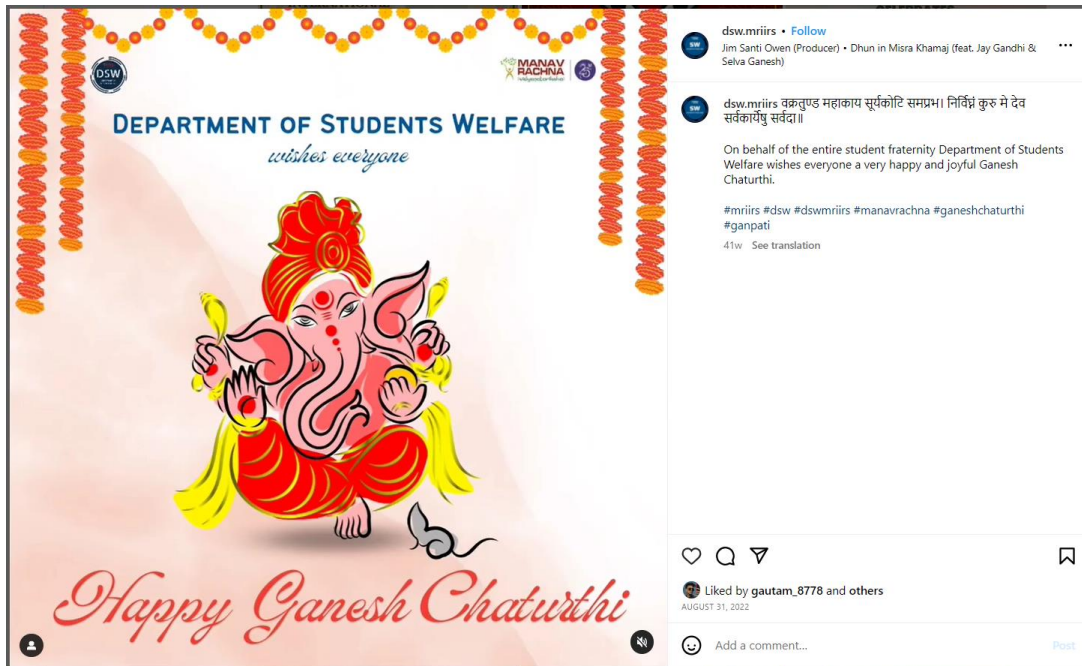

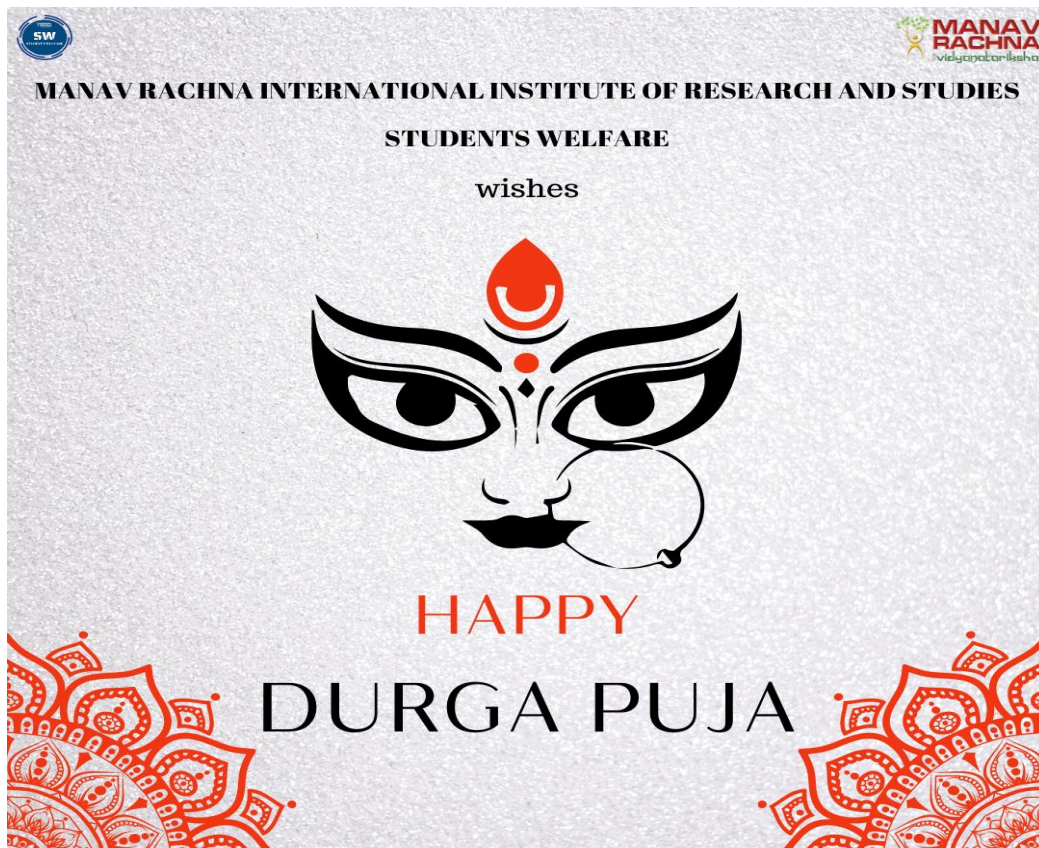

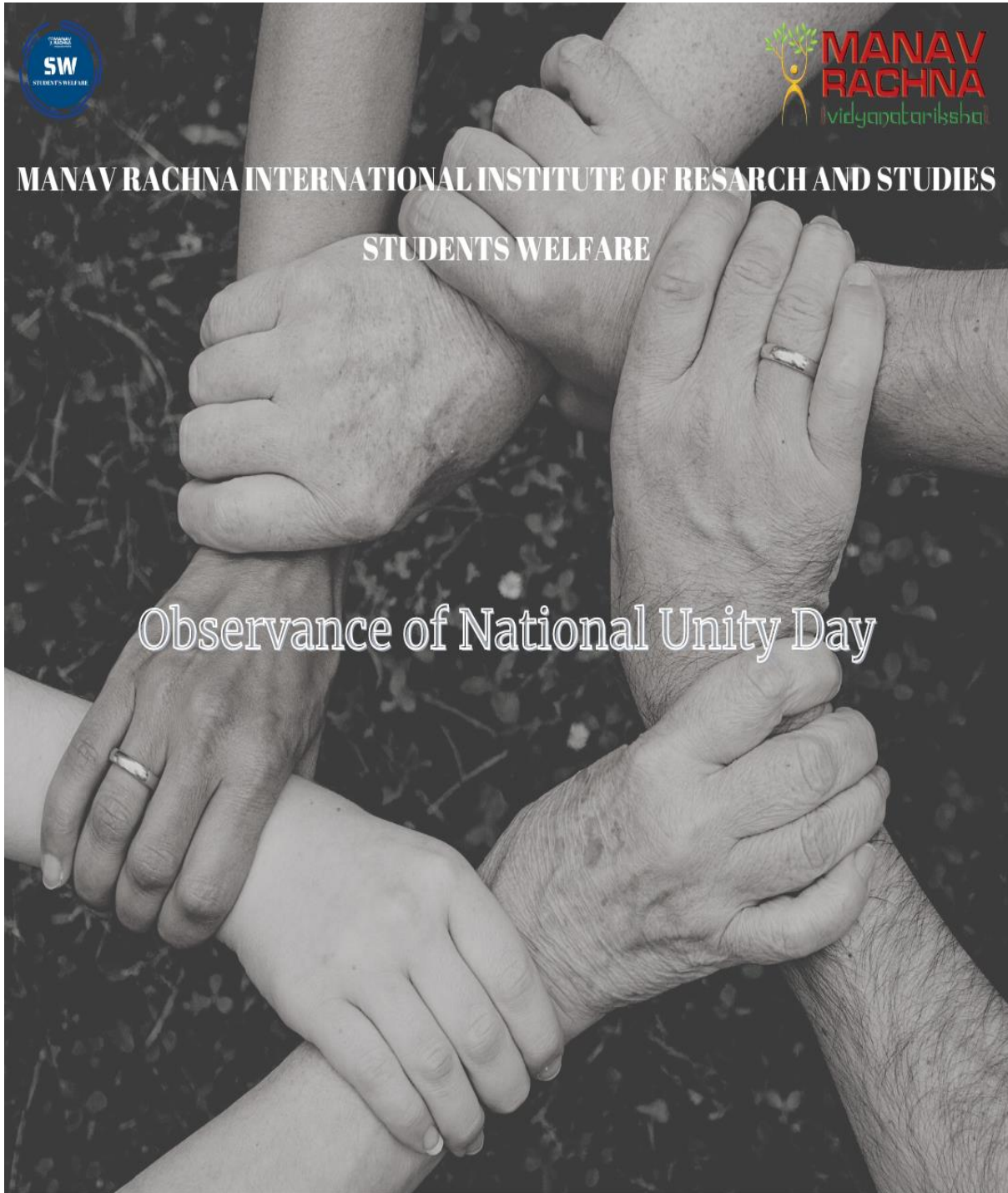
